Phone Policy—Phones are not to be used during scheduled hours of services and activities. This includes talking, texting, games, used as an mp3 player and anything else a phone might do. Students are not to give out another student's phone number or any other personal information for any reason. During "phone off" times, if a student needs to contact a parent they should bring it to the attention of an adult leader. Any improper use of a phone such as prank calls or texting could result in not being able to attend youth or activities.



Code of Conduct

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The following guidelines are listed so that you know in advance what is expected of our students in any given situation. By knowing and following these guidelines, you assist in making each time we're together a tremendous opportunity to focus on what God wants to accomplish in and through you. The goal of **RISE**.Student Ministries is that all we do is fun and safe for everyone. Your example in following the rules will encourage others to do the same.

1. Know where you are supposed to be. Be where you are supposed to be.

Each event has planned activities and locations for those activities. It is your responsibility to know what is going on. If you have questions, ask an adult leader. Students who leave our campus during an event will not be permitted to return. A parent will be notified that their student has left and needs to be promptly picked up.

***This applies to **ALL** scheduled activities, including
Wednesday night youth, Sunday service, and on or off campus***

2. Drugs, alcohol, tobacco, paint, propellants, firearms, knives, or any other kind of weapon, fireworks or explosives are NOT allowed.

3. Be considerate and careful of the clothing you wear.

Persons wearing clothing determined to be too revealing or with objectionable messages will be asked to change without argument or protest. Repeated disregard for dressing appropriately may be considered a violation of the rules. Remember we are often physically active with games so dress appropriately; we don't want to see bras, bellies, boxers or butts.

4. Students are to respect Adult Leaders and follow their instructions.

Adult Leaders have been trained and instructed in how to guide teens for each particular youth event. They are responsible for the enforcement of all restrictions and regulations. Their instructions are not suggestions and non-negotiable and are to be followed immediately.

5. Respect other participants.

We live in a world where people are self-centered and willing to get attention or whatever else they may want for themselves at the expense of others. We will not tolerate or allow people to intimidate, hurt, harass, threaten or take advantage of one another with their words or actions. This applies 24/7 on and off campus.

6. No PDA – Public Display of Affection

RISE. events are not designated to be dating opportunities. This kind of behavior never builds up a youth group.

7. Students may not drive their own car to events.

8. Students must obey rules and regulations of host locations.

We are often guests and must abide by the rules and regulations of our host locations. Be respectful of the personnel and property at each host location. If you make a mess, clean it up. If you break something, notify a leader. Our goal is to leave each location as nice as or nicer than we found it.

Consequences for breaking this contract could vary as follows:

1. Verbal Warning
2. Suspension from attending Wednesday night youth
3. Suspension from attending activities
4. Suspension on a long term basis
